

AMSAF is a 501c(3) non-profit organization. AMSAF works to help decrease the number of distracted and DUI-impaired drivers through strategic partnerships with the State of Arizona, police departments, local businesses, healthcare, insurance, legal and other prominent entities and individuals.

AMSAF is the first and only foundation of its kind to offer financial assistance for motorcycle training, financial assistance for helmets and Accident Scene Management. All three (3) programs help reduce crashes, injuries and fatalities.





To promote motorcycle safety and public awareness and to help reduce crashes, injuries, and fatalities in Arizona; recognizing that everyone has the duty and responsibility to share the road.

Motorcycling has soared in popularity as a recreational activity and mode of transportation. There are more than 370,000 registered motorcycles in Arizona, and the number continues to grow.

According to the Governor's Office of Highway Safety, Arizona has averaged more than 3,000 motorcycle crashes each year - and those numbers continue to grow.

Clearly, there is a crucial need to help reduce crashes, injuries, and fatalities and promote safety and awareness.








AMSAF partners with Chandler, Peoria, Surprise, Mesa, and Tempe police departments to hold citizen training events which are free to the public.

We have awarded multiple scholarships as a result of the training events.












SHARE THE ROAD &




SCHOLARSHIP PROCES


Through AMSAF, Arizona residents can get their motorcycle endorsement, save on insurance and receive lifesaving skills.

A Crash Course for the Motorcyclist (Basic course) Learn what to do in the first 5-30 minutes after a crash until help arrives.


Advanced Bystander Assistance
Learn to be a leader at a scene as well as how
to assist the EMS when they arrive. You must
have successfully completed the Basic course
within 2 years to take this course.

BANKING DISHRAD DRIVING



According to the National Safety Council, distracted driving is the cause for 1 of every 10 fatal accidents.

Since January 2021 it is illegal in Arizona to talk or text on a cellphone while driving unless it is being used in hands-free mode.


This law also applies to "stand-alone electronic devices" such as computers, pads, etc.

Know the law. Tell your friends. Save a life.

Arizona's new lane filtering law (SBI 273) allows a motorcycle to travel between lanes of traffic in very specific instances:

Here are some things you, as a motorcyclist, need to know:

NO FREEWAYS

This is not the California "lane splitting" law! The Arizona law only allows lane filtering on surface streets with a speed limit of 45 MPH or slower.

NOT EVERY STREET

Only on streets that have 2 or more lanes in the same direction.

· NOT MOVING

You may not pass a vehicle in motion. You may only overtake a vehicle between lanes that is stopped.

· NO SPEEDING

The maximum speed for a motorcycle traveling between lanes is 15 MPH.

And (you'll want to do this anyway) you must recognize that you can move between lanes safely before beginning lane filtering.

Here's a couple more things you should know:

This law is for 2-wheeled motorcycles. Sorry Trike, Spyder, Slingshot and Ural sidecar riders.

Make sure you tell all your non-motorcyclist friends and neighbors about the law and what to expect. It will help keep them and every motorcyclist safe.


STRIP THE ROAD
